## Prizes and categories 2010

- Medal for the Head of the River ( on non-handicapped times )
- Medals for any contested category ( 3 to race ) e.g. OJ 17 1x, women's novice eights, Vet C 2x etc
- Medals for vets as follows: Veteran handicaps will be applied by boat type, using the time of the winning senior boat of the appropriate type in the Head as the basis for the handicaps. The fastest veteran boat in each boat type after handicap will get a medal, unless it was a contested race within its own veteran category or it was the fastest boat on non-handicapped times.

### Notes

"Boat type" means coxed four, coxless four, coxed quad, coxless quad, pair, double, single and is applied separately for men and women.

To maximise the number of contested categories, crews with no opposition will be bumped up one category without consultation.

If scratches on the day mean that a category becomes uncontested, the remaining boat(s) in that category will also be bumped up one category without consultation.

A competitor can only race once in any one event i.e. if the same novice four wants to row in both divisions, it can only do so if it races in one Division as a novice four and in the other Division as, say, IM3.

A crew can win more than one prize but only if it enters two distinct events.

## Detailed Notes for BROE Users 2010

I have set up ( all at £5 per seat):

- Open and women's IM3 and novice coxed fours, coxless quads, pairs, doubles and singles, and novice coxed quads
- Open Vet B coxed fours, coxless fours, coxless quads, pairs, doubles and singles
- Junior and J16 open and women's coxed fours, coxless fours, coxless quads, pairs, doubles and singles
- J15 and J14 coxed quads, doubles and singles, open and women's

### Notes for all events

- Two divisions - I will assume you have sorted out your own doubling up and put you in the division you nominate. This means that crews of the same status and boat type might be racing in different divisions.

### For Masters events

- I have set up Masters events as Open Masters B. Please say in the notes column what Veteran age, status and sex you are.

### Please Note

- If your crew does not fit into any of these categories, please enter it on BROE if possible and let me know what you want to race. Please enter mixed as Open and use the Notes column to tell me it is mixed. Please enter younger juniors as J14 and tell me what age they really are. Otherwise, please send in a British Rowing entry form, preferably by email.
